Whilst we will make every effort to keep to the Timetable, exhibitors are reminded that it is a guideline only – and was compiled well before entries were open! Therefore, we reserve the right to amend timings and ring allocations if necessary. We will announce changes if they become necessary!

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to arrive at the Show field in sufficient time for the commencement of their classes. Classes will not commence prior to any given "Not before" timings. Bridgend Country Show Ltd will not accept responsibility for any exhibitor missing their classes and no entry fees will be refunded in this instance.

Where no "Not before times" are given, Classes will follow on.

Anyone abusing Judges, Stewards or other Officials will be required to leave the Show field – we are giving up our time so you can enjoy yourselves.

Objections must be lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the Class closing and must be accompanied by a £20.00 non-refundable fee. All objections will be judged on their merit. Objections relating to Society classes will be referred to the relevant Society before any judgement is reached.

Please note: All Societies receive copies of the entries prior to the Show running. So, entrants will have been checked. It is Not Acceptable for exhibitors to alter entries to non-registered horses or riders on the day and breaches of this will be reported to the relevant Society and you will be disqualified. So please don't do it.

A one-way system will be in operation for both Show days. Please follow the signs. Vehicles must be parked under the direction of the stewards. The gates will be open from 7.00am on both Show days.

Petrol generators are not permitted.

Please do not muck out your lorries / trailers onto the field – and take your litter home with you!! There are bins provided and clearly marked throughout the Show fields.

All vehicles admitted, along with their contents are left entirely at the owner's risk.

Protective headgear **MUST** be worn by **anyone** riding a horse/pony for any reason. This must comply with the relevant standards in force and must be correctly fastened. This applies to everyone – no exceptions. Anyone not complying will be asked to leave the Show field. Bridgend Country Show Ltd accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

Sensory Whiskers – please refer to any rulings made by the Society under which you intend to exhibit.

Equine passports and vaccinations: all horses / ponies should have received at least one vaccination before entering any showing classes (foals excepted). Yearly vaccinations are acceptable. Random passports checks may be undertaken.

Mare or gelding, 4 years or over. To exceed 148cm.Not to have competed or won at County Show level in 2023 or have won other than at local smaller shows in 2024. Riders must be 15 years and over. Aimed at introducing horses to a busier show environment. Horses will not be ridden by the judge in this class.

#### **Small Hunter**

Mare or gelding, 4 years or over, to exceed 148 but not to exceed 158cm. Riders must be 15 years and over.

#### Lightweight Hunter

Mare or gelding. Riders must be 15 years and over.

4

#### Middleweight Hunter

Mare or gelding, 4 years or over, capable of carrying 12st 7lbs and not exceeding 14 stone.

Riders must be 15 years and over.

#### Heavyweight Hunter

Mare or gelding, 4 years or over, capable of carrying 14st plus. Riders must be 15 years and over.

Hunter Championship - Open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> prize-winners from Classes 1 – 5

#### **RISING STAR AMATEUR RULES FOR 2024**

Available to members and non-members eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules.

Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2024 are separate to BSHA Amateur rules.

Please see the full list of Rising Star rules in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. www.britishshowhorse.org If in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed.

Classes 6 to 15 inclusive qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

#### Rising Star Ridden Cob

6 <u>Lightweight Cob</u>: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### 7

#### Heavyweight Cob:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### 8 Maxi Cob:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### Rising Star Riding Horse:

#### Small Riding Horse

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Small Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### 10 Large Riding Horse:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Large Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

Hack: Small and Large Hack:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 160cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### Racehorse to Show Horse:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to Thoroughbred and Arab horses retired from race training. Highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### Rising Star Ridden Hunters

#### Small/Lightweight Hunter:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

#### Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September

#### 15 Rising Star Ladies Show Horse:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms, suitable to carry a side saddle, to be ridden side saddle by a lady. Open to all Hacks, Cobs, Riding Horses and Hunters. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

Championship – Open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> prize-winners from Classes 6 - 15

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket.

Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on your entry form.

#### **DAY TICKETS & SHOW TICKETS**

Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider, and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes (except RIHS Amateur Classes & RIHS Working Show Horse Class). A Show Ticket has the same criteria and covers all days of a Show running for longer than one day. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website.

Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

#### BSHA SUPREME OF THE YEAR

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final.

The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2024.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024.

#### Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership.

Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes.

Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.

The first three go forward to the Final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on 24th August 2024

RoR rosettes 1st -4th and a RoR branded prize to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

#### To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won:

A ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (incl.
