Whilst we will make every effort to keep to the Timetable, exhibitors are reminded that it is a guideline only – and was compiled well before entries were open! Therefore, we reserve the right to amend timings and ring allocations if necessary. We will announce changes if they become necessary!

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to arrive at the Show field in sufficient time for the commencement of their classes. Classes will not commence prior to any given "Not before" timings. Bridgend Country Show Ltd will not accept responsibility for any exhibitor missing their classes and no entry fees will be refunded in this instance.

Where no "Not before times" are given, Classes will follow on.

Anyone abusing Judges, Stewards or other Officials will be required to leave the Show field – we are giving up our time so you can enjoy yourselves.

Objections must be lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the Class closing and must be accompanied by a £20.00 non-refundable fee. All objections will be judged on their merit. Objections relating to Society classes will be referred to the relevant Society before any judgement is reached.

Please note: All Societies receive copies of the entries prior to the Show running, so entrants will have been checked. It is Not Acceptable for exhibitors to alter entries to non-registered horses or riders on the day and breaches of this will be reported to the relevant Society and you will be disqualified. So please don't do it.

A one-way system will be in operation for both Show days. Please follow the signs . Vehicles must be parked under the direction of the stewards. The gates will be open from 7.00am on both Show days.

Petrol generators are not permitted.

Please do not muck out your lorries / trailers onto the field – and take your litter home with you!! There are bins provided and clearly marked throughout the Showfields All vehicles admitted, along with their contents are left entirely at the owner's risk.

Protective headgear **MUST** be worn by **anyone** riding a horse/pony for any reason. This must comply with the relevant standards in force and must be correctly fastened. This applies to everyone – no exceptions. Anyone not complying will be asked to leave the Show field. Bridgend Country Show Ltd accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation

### Sensory Whiskers – please refer to any rulings made by the Society under which you intend to exhibit.

Equine passports and vaccinations: all horses / ponies should have received at least one vaccination before entering any showing classes (foals excepted) . Yearly vaccinations are acceptable. Random passports checks may be undertaken.

- 3) Join SWPA via www.showingscene.com as a 2025 Member
- 4) Take a picture of the card and upload to the relevant Championship Class (Championship Classes are 1-134 on Saturday of the Championships)

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket.

Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on your entry form.

#### **DAY TICKETS & SHOW TICKETS**

Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider, and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes (except RIHS Amateur Classes & RIHS Working Show Horse Class). A Show Ticket has the same criteria and covers all days of a Show running for longer than one day. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website.

Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

#### **BSHA SUPREME OF THE YEAR**

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of the Year Final.

The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2025.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

Open Cob

Mare or gelding, 4 years and over. Exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 155cms.

Please read BSHA rules above before entering. You must be registered or have a Day Ticket.

2

Open Maxi Cob

Mare or gelding, 4 years and over. Exceeding 155cms. To be judges as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of cob type. To be shown hogged.

Please read BSHA rules above before entering. You must be registered or have a Day Ticket.

3

Open Hack

Mare or gelding 4 years and over. Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 160cms.

Please read BSHA rules above before entering. You must be registered or have a Day Ticket

4

Open Riding Horse

Mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms

Please read BSHA rules above before entering. You must be registered or have a Day Ticket.

Classes 1-4 are qualifiers for The National Welsh Championship Show 10<sup>th</sup> August 2025-National Ridden Welsh Part Bred Championships. All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in each class (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry.

#### TURLEY & GILL AMATEUR HOME PRODUCED QUALIFIER

Owners, Riders and Horses must be registered with BSHA or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. This class is a qualifier for the Turley & Gill Family Amateur Home-Produced Supreme Final to be held at the BSHA National Championship Show. Open to horses to be Home- Produced and ridden by an Amateur; please see rule 6 A-C in 2025 BSHA Rulebook . Horses must be registered as a either a Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse. The two highest placed unqualified in the top five will qualify for the final at the BSHA National Championship Show.

Please read BSHA rules above before entering. You must be registered or have a Day Ticket.

### DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW; December 2025 – dates to be confirmed

#### **RISING STAR AMATEUR RULES FOR 2025**

Available to members and pre – registered non-members, 15 yrs and over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules.

Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2025 are separate to BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the full list of Rising Star rules in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. www.britishshowhorse.org If in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed.

Classes 6 & 7 and 12 – 19 inclusive qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

#### Small/Lightweight Hunter:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Hunter Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

#### Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE BSHA MEMBERSHIP IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION.

In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Hunter Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January of the calendar year holding the classes. **Horses will be ridden by the Judge** and will be stripped for conformation assessment. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 23<sup>rd</sup> 2025.

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes  $1^{st}$  – $4^{th}$  plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher  $1^{st}$  £30,  $2^{nd}$  £20,  $3^{rd}$  £10

**To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won:** a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class **except** Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or RoR/In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won (win) three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Tattersall RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings,

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

#### The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2026

All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB.** All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup> –4<sup>th</sup> plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £30, 2<sup>nd</sup> £20, 3<sup>rd</sup> £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, **the winner also qualifies** for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2025. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day 10

Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete.

Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2026.

**Prizes** – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup> –4<sup>th</sup> plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £20, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, the winner will qualify for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 23<sup>rd</sup> 2025. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

#### Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2025

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

All RoR members entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a current safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 2025

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1<sup>st</sup> –4<sup>th</sup> + Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1<sup>st</sup> £20, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5.

Championship – Open to 1st and 2nd prize-winners of Classes 8 – 11

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. (2025)

Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

They will be pulled into line in any order and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised. There will be NO conformation marks. Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed standards
